

- Terrorism
- Cyberattacks
- Organised crime gangs
- Opportunists
- Fraudulent pick-ups

THE IMPACT OF CARGO CRIME



THREATS TO BUSINESS

- Risks to employee & public safety
- Financial cost of recovery
- Inability to fulfill customer orders
- Damaged reputation & brand
- Disrupted production schedules
- Lost productivity
- Increased insurance premiums

ECONOMIC THREATS

- Major companies want to avoid crime 'hotspots'
- Potential impact on employment
 & national/regional investment
- Additional pressure on police resources

The true cost of loss can be 5-7 x the value of the stolen goods. In Europe alone, one EU study* estimated the cost of cargo crime to be some €8.2 billion annually.

THE SIZE OF THE PROBLEM

In Europe, cargo crime costs businesses over €8.2 billion a year, according to a European Parliament study.

- Leading trade associations estimate cargo losses in Germany alone to be valued at over €2.2 billion per annum
- The true 'cost of loss' can be 5-7x the value of the goods stolen
- Low penalties for offenders and rich potential rewards exacerbate the growth of incidents. Cargo crimes recorded by TAPA EMEA rose 114% in 2019 to over 8,500 incidents
- · Still, the majority of cargo thefts go unreported

Funding Organised Crime Groups

The relative ease with which OCGs can target goods in supply chains and the high values of individual shipments is helping fund other forms of serious crime, including illicit drugs and people trafficking.





INCIDENT

Cargo crimes reported to TAPA in 2019/2020:

- 15,011 incidents
- · in 56 countries in EMEA
- losses of more than €310.5m
- average loss for major losses €532,882
- average daily loss €424,000 every day for 2 years

PHARMACEUTICALS – A PRIME TARGET

Losses recorded by TAPA's incident database include high value thefts of pharmaceuticals, such as:

- €5 million theft from a facility in Santiago de Compostela in Spain
- €2.6 million theft from a facility in Lokoja, Nigeria
- €1 million hijacking of a truck en route in Apulia, Italy
- €850,000 theft from a Services 3rd Party Facility in Romania
- €513,541 products stolen from a truck at a motorway services in Bradford, UK
- €500,000 a theft from vehicle crime in Rothenstein, Germany
- €481,068 a fraudulent pick-up of pharma from a facility in Moscow
- €400,000 product stolen from a truck in an unsecured parking in France
- €350,976 another case of fraud at a Services 3rd Party Facility in Russia
- €340,000 a theft from a Destination Facility in Chevilly-Larve, France





THE IMPACT OF PHARMA THEFTS

Risk to public health means thefts of pharma products from supply chains can result in the destruction of the entire production of drugs with the same batch codes as those stolen.

Indirect costs for pharma companies also include:

- · Recovered product testing, destruction
- · Investigation & added security costs
- · Replacement product and transportation costs
- · Loss of sales
- · Communication with affected parties
- Insurance costs
- · Outreach to client costs
- · Recall process costs
- · Reputational/share price damage





REDUCING CRIME

TAPA helps its members protect their supply chains from criminal attacks through:

- Industry Standards for Facilities, Trucking & Secure Parking
- Training over 1,000 supply chain security professionals annually
- Incident Intelligence crime 'alerts' and monthly, quarterly and annual analysis
- Secure route planning tools to manage safe transport routes, show previous incidents on specific routes, and locations of TAPA-approved secure truck parking sites
- Networking EMEA conferences and national events in cargo crime 'hotspots'
- Representation with key stakeholders i.e. European Commission, World Customs Organization, INTERPOL, Europol, IUMI, United Nations etc.

CERTIFIED INDUSTRY STANDARDS



Facility Security Requirements (FSR)

TAPA's Facility Security Requirements (FSR) represent minimum Standards specifically for secure warehousing, or in-transit storage, within a supply chain.

- The first TAPA FSR was conducted in 2001
- · FSR certifications are site/facility specific
- TAPA's FSR is reviewed/updated every 3 years based on current risks
- · Three levels of certification:
- FSR Level A Highest security protection
- FSR Level B Mid-level security protection
- FSR Level C Lowest Security protection
- Levels A, B & C are audited by TAPA-approved Independent Audit Bodies (IAB)
- Level C can also be achieved by self-certification by an in-house TAPA-trained auditor



CERTIFIED INDUSTRY STANDARDS



Trucking Security Requirements (TSR)

TAPA's Trucking Security Requirements (TSR) focus exclusively on transport by truck and represents minimum Standards specifically for transporting products via road within a supply chain.

- TSR was launched in 2005
- TAPA's TSR is reviewed/updated every 3 years based on current risks
- · Three levels of certification:
- TSR Level 1 Highest security protection
- TSR Level 2 Mid-level security protection
- TSR Level 3 Lowest level security protection
- Levels 1,2 & 3 are audited by TAPA-approved Independent Audit Bodies (IAB)
- Level 3 can also be achieved by self-certification by an in-house TAPA-trained auditor



CERTIFIED INDUSTRY STANDARDS



Parking Security Requirements (PSR)

Over 50% of the supply chain losses reported to TAPA EMEA involve trucks stopping in unsecured parking places.

- Launched in 2019, TAPA's PSR offers a number of options and security levels to Parking Place Operators (PPOs)
- In EMEA, TAPA sees demand for 2,000 secure truck parking sites offering +400,000 parking places
- Three levels of classification:

Parking Security Partner

Sign a declaration to become a TAPA PSR Partner to confirm basic security controls are in place. Your participation in the programme will need to be renewed annually.

Self-Certification

A self-certification audit to meet the requirements of PSR Level 3 and issuing of TAPA certification valid for 3 years. TAPA will conduct sample audits of self-certified sites.

Independent Audit Body (IAB) Certification (Levels 1, 2 and 3)

The full certification programme has three levels with TAPA Parking Security Requirements (PSR) certification by Independent Audit Bodies:

PSR Level 1 = highest security protection with a formal certification

PSR Level 2 = mid-level security protection with a formal certification

PSR Level 3 = lowest security protection with a formal certification

TAPA'S PSR is supported by the Association's Secure Parking Online Tool, which enables members to map cargo crime incidents on specific routings and identify TAPA PSR secure parking locations to protect high value, theft targeted loads.

TAPA EMEA's Parking Security Requirements (PSR) is the world's fastest-growing industry standard for secure truck parking ...

- Over 7,600 secure truck parking places
- PPOs in 14 countries supporting TAPA PSR
- · 75 sites in TAPA's secure parking database
- Growing support from key partners, i.e. SNAP Account and Bosch Secure Truck Parking

GROWTH ACCELERATORS: Support from key partners, new PSR brochure for target PPOs/sites, more media coverage



The lack of secure truck parking poses the greatest risk to supply chain resilience for all products. To help meet demand, TAPA EMEA is campaigning for or advocating...

- Alignment of TAPA's PSR Standard with the EU Safe & Secure Truck Parking Areas (SSTPA) Standard
- Transition of existing unclassified parking sites to certified programmes
- EU/government project to part finance new/upgraded secure truck parking facilities
- Private investment initiatives for new secure truck parks across the EMEA region
- Recycling of warehouse parking enclosures not utilised full-time as part- or full-time certified parking sites
